Ametha Kennedy Carr was born in Elmore City, OK on August 31, 1923 to S.M. (Chock) and Loda Bradley Kennedy. She was the only daughter among four sons. Ametha died peacefully on October 19, 2017 in Truth or Consequences, NM.

During her lifetime, Ametha was co-owner/operator of Ted's Service Station in Hurley, NM. She was a house mother for two sororities at NMSU and a house parent at Lee Moore Children's Home in El Paso, TX.
