Bettye Jo (Johnson) Rushing, a longtime resident of Wynnewood, Oklahoma, passed from this life on Friday, April 10, 2020 in Norman, Oklahoma. Bettye was born on February 19, 1942, in Wynnewood, Oklahoma, to Tommie L. and Gladys P. Johnson. Bettye spent her younger years in Wynnewood and spoke fondly of family memories that included large holiday gatherings and family reunions. She completed her education and graduated from Wynnewood High School in 1959. She also attended and graduated from the Dallas School of Business. Bettye worked for many years at Kerr McGee Corporation and then later worked for the State of Oklahoma at Pauls Valley State School, caring for individuals with developmental disabilities. She enjoyed playing solitaire and other card games, doing word search puzzles, playing dominoes, watching game shows on television, going to the casino, and talking with family and friends. She also loved watching sporting events, especially OU and when her grandkids played. She was a Girl Scout troop leader, member of the Wynnewood Savages Booster Club, and a member and secretary of the Order of the

Eastern Star Faith Chapter 55.OES for 20+ years. She was a member of Mount Carmel Baptist Church and adored her church family. While living at Grace, she enjoyed her church family at Northgate Baptist Church in Norman, OK. Her parents Tommie and Gladys Johnson, brothers, Tommie L.
