Billy Joe spent his childhood days in the Whitebead area.

As an adult, most folks became acquainted with Billy Joe either at the U.S. Post Office in Pauls Valley or at the Garvin County Court House where he was a custodian. He spent each day at the Post office from 5:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m. then was at the Court House until 3:00 p.m. when he would return to the Post Office and complete his day at 5:00 p.m. The postal job was six days a week. Billy Joe was quiet and shy. His special gift of accepting others "just as they were" is the one attribute most will probably remember him by.

He was a very talented worker with wood. Fishing and going to the casino were his favorite hobbies.

Billy Joe is survived by his son Robert Taylor of Yukon, OK; brothers, Noble Taylor of Pauls Valley and Larry Taylor of Duncan, OK; sisters; JoAnn Morris, Bonnie Wilkerson, Linda Moore, and Connie Nabors all of Pauls Valley, OK and Brenda Foster of Arkansas.
