Buddy Lee Harbison of Antioch, OK was born to Cecil and Ruby (Robbins) Harbison in Caney, OK on September 29, 1951 and entered eternal life on August 27, 2021 at the age of 69 years.

Buddy grew up in the Antioch community and attended Elmore City schools. He enlisted in the U. S. Army and graduated high school in Germany. Buddy and his wife Donna celebrated 47 years on May 12th of this year. After serving in the U.S. Army he spent the remainder of his life working in the oil fields and spent over 30 years as the owner/operator of his own truck. Buddy was a handyman and could fix anything. He always showed up to help others fix things when his expertise was needed. Buddy believed and taught his children that to survive, you must learn more than one occupation.
