Watching OU football, WWE and John Wayne movies with his good buddy John, was a true and simple delight for him. David also enjoyed rodeos, dances and visiting with family and his staff. He loved attending church and really let his light shine while praising the Lord with his tambourine.

David's life was much different than others, as he was never physically nor mentally able to participate in most of the things that we take for granted. However, David loved everything about his life and everyone in it.

David entered the life everlasting on September 10, 2021 at Mercy Hospital in Oklahoma City after a long and courageous battle.
