“ I have thought long and hard about what is the most memorable aspect of my dad. It has to be the pride he has in all of his children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren. Here is what brought this home for me.

In 1986 I made All-state defensive lineman of the year, and played in that game at Northwestern University, there is a picture of my dad, mom and me wearing the medal I received for it. If you look deeper into the picture you can't help but see the pride on his face. The medal and the game are pleasant but vague memories, however seeing that look of pride on dad's face has stayed with me ever since. When we were looking through the pictures of him, mom commented that it was difficult to find a picture of him without one of his kids, grand kids, or great-grand kids.
