Edith Faye Rosier, known as "Rosie" or "Granny Rosie" to those in her life died peacefully on April 16, 2012 at Pauls Valley General Hospital.

Rosie always enjoyed the small things in life. She will be remembered for her enjoyment of things like butterscotch hard candies, pretty earrings and rings,

her love of the outdoors, mowing her lawn and planting flowers and trees, playing bingo and eating queso at Los Dos. Rosie very much enjoyed her friends and has been blessed in life by some special people. But most of all, Rosie loved her family. It seemed that her love grew larger with each generation.

Participating in the lives of her great-grandchildren has been the greatest joy of Granny's last 14 years. When she could, you could find her taking the great-grandkids to Los Dos Amigos on Saturdays for lunch, attending birthday parties, Sunday dinners, Christmas's, Thanksgivings and other family events. She was always ready with a firm pinch on the cheek and a \$5 bill for the grandkids to spend on ice cream or candy.
