



Fred Lloyd Fisher

July 9, 1944 - February 11, 2026

Fred Lloyd Fisher was born on July 9, 1944, in Ardmore, Oklahoma, to Paul Fisher and Winnie Bell (Stallcup) Fisher. He passed away on February 11, 2026, in Pauls Valley, Oklahoma, at the age of 81. Growing up, Fred was “100% boy.” He loved fishing, dancing, the outdoors, and working with livestock. He was active in the Elmore City FFA and graduated from Elmore City High School in 1962. On May 25, 1963, he married the love of his life, Marilyn June (Holt) Fisher, in Holdenville, Oklahoma. Together they built a life rooted in hard work, family, and faithfulness. Fred began his career as a milkman right out of high school before entering the oilfield, where he worked his way up from the bottom to become a respected tool pusher on drilling rigs. Over the years, he also worked for Ellsworth, United Petroleum Transports, and Mission Petroleum. Eventually, he became an owner-operator under the business name Fisher & Sons Trucking, working with Silver Star Construction. Throughout his long career, he hauled everything from dog food to oil and rock, always taking pride in an honest day’s work. After retiring in 2018, Fred devoted his time to the things he loved most — his cows, his family, and his community. He was active with the Pauls Valley FFA Chapter, serving as the swine superintendent and supporting young people who shared his passion for agriculture. He enjoyed tinkering around his house and, most of all, climbing into his truck and driving the back roads. His grandson Garrett logged many miles alongside him. Fred affectionately referred to Garrett as “Meathead,” a nickname given with love. The highlights of Fred’s life were his

wife Marilyn, his children, his grandchildren, and his cows. He taught those around him the value of hard work and respect. He was generous and kind, and you always knew exactly where you stood with him. If he liked you, you knew it — and if he didn't, you knew that too. There was never any question about his honesty or his heart. Fred's legacy lives on in the family he cherished, the lessons he taught, and the many lives he impacted through his work and community involvement.
