Growing up Ginny played the clarinet in the band at school, she graduated in 1975 from Pauls Valley High School. After graduation she loved to travel, garden, and re-organize everything that she could, she was always a very clean person. She married the love of her life, Gregory Brown, over 20 years ago in Noble, Oklahoma. She spent a majority of her career working for the Oklahoma Indigent Defense System and she worked there until her retirement in 2022. Ginny loved her animals, she loved all animals, she would pick up any stray that she could if it meant that it was safe. She leaves behind four animals of her own, two dogs: Jodi and Lilly, and two cats: Hazel and Pepper. Along with her animals, Ginny loved her grandchildren, she loved them so much she used to take them to the zoo, the Omniplex (now known as Oklahoma Science Museum), the Sulphur park, to bake cupcakes and decorate cookies with them, and take them to the movies. Ginny also loved cooking, it was said she made the best sweet potatoes there were. She always tried to be present and be involved in whatever they were doing, she was what they would call a social butterfly who loved everyone including her family and friends dearly. 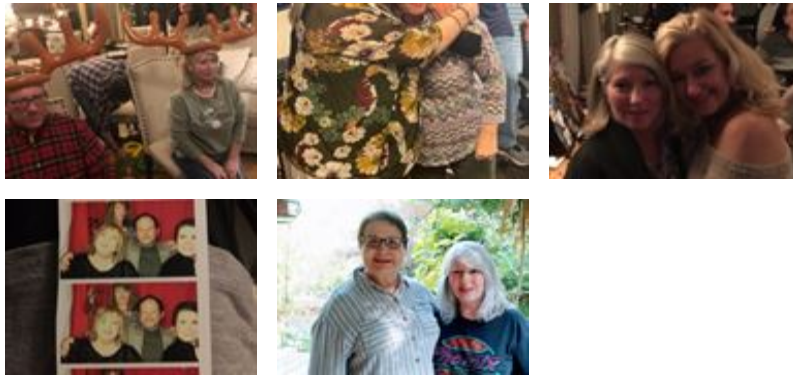
