He believed in having fun and spent the early years of his life camping, boating and snow skiing. He invented his own way to come up on a slalom water ski known as “The Pyle get up”, which took much dedication and endurance.

His latter years were spent working and sustaining Oak Tree Ranch raising Hereford cattle. He graduated high school from Elmore City, OK., and worked as a barber to put himself through college, graduating from The University of Central Oklahoma with a degree in social work. Before retiring from DHS, he held numerous director positions and took pride in serving the citizens of Oklahoma.

Jerry was born May 29th, 1946 to Mack and Helen Pyle. He was preceded in death by his parents, wife Kay and one daughter Andrea “Sissy” Santine. He leaves behind 4 children: his son Steven Pyle, wife Brenda and their 2 children Whitley and Brady; daughter Carolyn Rogers, husband Mike and their children 3 children, Austin, his wife Shelby and their daughter Rowyn, Jerico,
