August 3, 1943 - May 26, 2025

Kenneth Wayne Cain, known to many as Kenny, passed away peacefully on May 26, 2025, in Elmore City, Oklahoma, surrounded by those who loved him most. He was 81 years old.

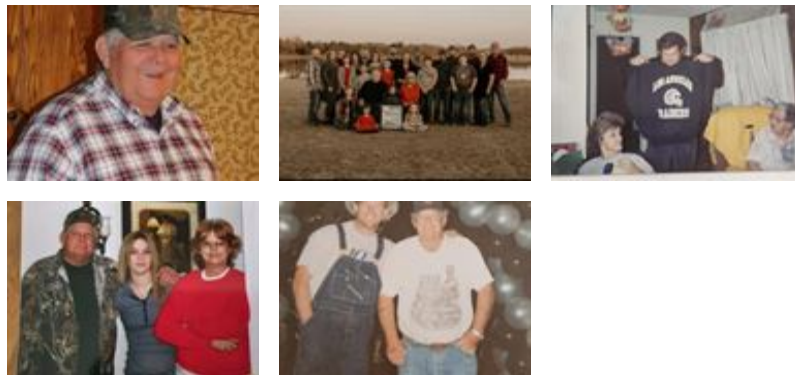

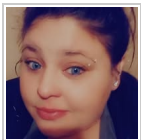
