Our oldest sisters were best friends in high school while we were still students at Parks for us and Katie for the younger Moore girls. We were rivals in basketball in elementary school, but played on the same team at Elmore City. Even though I was in the class with Bonnie Moore, I was closer in age to Laveta. She and I spent 10 days sharing a hospital room in the Wynnewood Hospital when we were about 14 years old, and that started a long friendship. I am so saddened she has left this world without the great wife, mother, sister, aunt, grandmother and friend she was. As a teen, I always enjoyed going to the Moore home for sleepovers. Aleta could cook meals as good as our own mother, and made the best frozen peaches I ever ate, served slightly frozen with plain cream is still my favorite way to eat them, if not cooked into a cobbler and served with cream. No need to mention all the rest of the good things she made, anyone who knew the family always ate a meal with them. We had lots of nice times together, and Laveta will be greatly missed. Another memory we have is that we each received an identical gift from our respective children. I wore mine for over 25 years until it was stolen while I was a patient in ICU at Baptist Hospital at OKC getting chest xrays in 2009. I miss it so much and have yet to find another like it to buy.
