Loreata Martin, 88, died at her home in Wynnewood, OK surrounded by her family and friends on December 5, 2023. Loreata and her husband, Bonney Martin, formerly owned and operated Martin's Fertilizer in Wynnewood and Pauls Valley, OK., were farmer stockmen and in the oil business.

Loreata was born August 9th, 1935 to Juanita (Mauldin) Mullens and Roy William Mullens in Pauls Valley, OK.

She graduated from Pauls Valley high school in 1953. Following graduation she worked as a telephone operator at Southwestern Bell in Pauls Valley. She married Bonney Ray Martin in 1954 at the First Methodist Church in Elmore City, OK. Loreata and Bonney moved to Wynnewood in 1955.

Loreata worked beside her husband and was the bookkeeper in their business that they started in 1964. She was a wonderful, loving mother and raised her four children in a devoted Christian home. She was also a faithful wife to her husband, Bonney, for 60 years. She was extremely caring, always willing to help her family and friends in any way she could.

Loreata became a Christian at the age of fifteen and was baptized at the Paul and Pine Church of Christ in Pauls Valley, OK. Since 1955, she was a faithful member of the Wynnewood Church of Christ. She loved to sing, had a gorgeous alto voice, and shared her musical gift of singing at numerous singings and funerals. In her last days, one of her greatest comforts were singing hymns.
