Melvett G. Chambers son of Mattie Pearl and John G. Chambers was born in Houston, Texas on October 30, 1946. His family moved to Denver, Colorado in 1953 and Melvett attended Corlett Elementary. His family relocated again moving to Cheyenne, Wyoming in 1959 and Melvett attended McCormick Junior High School and graduated from Central High School. Melvett accepted Christ as his Lord and Savior at an early age, and was baptized at the Second Baptist Church in Cheyenne, Wyoming. He graduated from The University of Wyoming with a degree in Accounting.

Melvett was a man of many talents/gifts he taught graphic arts/art, photography at the Community College of Denver. He was an active member of the Photographic Society of America and an award winning Photographer receiving numerous awards including Artist of the Arbuckles, and Kodak. He published two books "Black History Quiz" and Soul Cookin Southern Style" and co-authored many other books.

Melvett and Andrea built their home in Hennepin, Oklahoma in 1998. He attended Oklahoma Master Gardener and completed the required course of study on March 22, 2007. He worked with the Department of Agriculture in the Plasticulture program, was the Market Manager of the Ardmore Main Street Farmers market and worked closely with the Chickasaw farms in Davis, Oklahoma. He wrote articles that appeared in the Ardmore in a column called the "Backyard Bulletin". He won the Outstanding Plasticulture Produce Marketing Award for Excellence in Farmer Market Presentation, in February of

2010 and was presented with the Small Farmer of the Year Award in October of 2014.

Melvett leaves to mourn his parting from this world his wife of 23 years Andrea, two brothers; Paul (Bobbi) of Philadelphia, PA and Marshall (Joyce) Chambers State Park, South Carolina; three children; Yoshi (Leslie) Thomas of Louisiana, Damon (Nicole) Chambers and Rosalind (Emmitt) Gibson of Colorado; four grandchildren: Darrian, Deacon, DeArieus, Kerrick Chambers and a host of other relatives and many friends.
