Nathan Eugene “Gene” Riedl of Pauls Valley, Oklahoma was born to Frank Chester and Frances Marie (Kraisinger) Riedl on January 27, 1931 in Larned, Kansas and passed from this life on April 22, 2008 in Pauls Valley at the age of 77 years.

Gene graduated from high school in Great Bend, Kansas. He then attended Wichita State University, Phillips University and Phillips Theological Seminary graduating with a Master of Divinity degree.

Gene was ordained as a minister of the First Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in September of 1959. He served the Christian Church for 35 years in Kansas, Iowa, Missouri, and Oklahoma. Gene came to Pauls Valley in 1992 to serve and later retired from the ministry.

On May 29, 1976, Gene married Jane Hudson in Enid, Oklahoma.

Gene was active in scouting, music, church activities and was a 32nd degree Mason. He loved the outdoors and enjoyed fishing, wood crafts, and working with his dog.
