Peggy Mae Heim, of Pauls Valley, Oklahoma was welcomed into her heavenly home on July 8, 2020. She was born December 30, 1946 in Three Rivers, Michigan, the third daughter of the Reverend James R. Cissna and Frances Elizabeth (Schreck) Cissna.

The family moved to Tulsa, Oklahoma in 1950 when her father became Pastor of Home Gardens Assembly of God. She attended Tulsa Public Schools, graduating from Central in 1965. She went to Southwestern Assembly of God College, Waxahachie, Texas. Returning to Tulsa, she worked at Bank of Oklahoma and then American Airlines. Following this Peggy sold real estate in Florida, cell phones in Texas, and as an administrative assistant in California. However, her primary job was loving her family and serving God. She did both with exceptional devotion all of her life.

Her nieces and nephews, and their children all proclaimed her as their “favorite aunt.” People who worked with her declared her as “friend,” she loved being “Grandma.” Friends that she worshiped with declared that she was a “prayer warrior.” The people she served in her Skid Row ministry called her “Mama Peggy.” All of them agree that “Peggy gives the best hugs ever.” Peggy is survived by sons Richard Paul Heim and his triplets, Brody Heim, Elizabeth Heim, and Connor Heim, all of Glendale, California, and Michael Dewayne Heim wife Marianne, and son Braydan Heim, Phoenix, Arizona. Rick, Mike, and their families were the center of her love. That love was extended to her sisters, Christina Cissna Broxson, Gulf Breeze, Florida, and

Frances Cissna Butler, Pauls Valley, Oklahoma.

Preceding her in death were her parents, J. R. Cissna and Elizabeth Cissna, brother-in-law, John Broxson, and nieces Angela Broxson Strange and Dayna Broxson.
