



Port Schnorrenberg

August 21, 1927 - December 6, 2007

Port Schnorrenberg of Pauls Valley, Oklahoma was born to Jessie E. and Laura A. (Portwood) Schnorrenberg on August 21, 1927 in Blair, Oklahoma and passed from this life on December 6, 2007 in Pauls Valley, Oklahoma at the age of 80 years.

Port grew up and attended school in Warren, Oklahoma. He enlisted in the U.S. Navy at the age of 17, during WWII and served in Japan. After his discharge in 1946 he Moved to Stillwater and attended Oklahoma A&M where he obtained his Bachelor of Science Degree in Horticulture. Mr. Schnorrenberg also served in the Oklahoma National Guard with the Alpha Company; 245th Tank Battalion and was called again to serve his country during the Korean Conflict where he earned the Bronze Star. On September 12, 1948 Port married JoAnn Burrus in Altus, Oklahoma. He then worked for Halliburton Oil Company, Dead shot Pest Control and later owned and operated Schnorrenberg Weed Control and JoAnn's Fabrics in Pauls Valley, Oklahoma.

Port was a member of the Paul and Pine Church of Christ for over 50 years and served as a bible school teacher, deacon, song leader and elder. He was a past president of the Chamber of Commerce and Rotary Club. Port also served on the Board of Directors with the Donihoo-Colley complex in Pauls Valley. He and Joann were instrumental in the Depot restoration project,

among many other civic activities.

The highlights of Port's life were his wife, children, family, church and friends. In his spare time he enjoyed singing in a barber shop quartet and helped organize the annual watermelon seed spitting contest. Port enjoyed having coffee with his friends and had a great passion for O. S. U. sports.

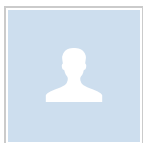
