Born in Oklahoma city, Oklahoma 1956

Raised in the dirt of Broken Arrow, OK

He Learned to pick and sing with his 4 brothers who were all musicians. He tried his luck in California in

1978 and made his first recording there on a 45 LP.

He like most ran out of money out west and came back to

Oklahoma and Texas where he spent the next

15 years writing songs and trying to make the big time sending demo tapes all over the world. He finally

had some luck back where he was born in Oklahoma city. He got

his first contract and started working

with producer John Ware. He then was pushed out to Nashville in

1994 to work with other writers and

learn more about how the bigger industry works. In 1996 he was

signed as a member of BMI and also a

member of the group at Paradise Cove Publishing.

This is my late father's legacy. This is his music.

At his passing a dear friend of his wrote this about how he met

Dallas. "Rob was a prolific songwriter,

having been a member of BMI and also a member of the group at

Paradise Cove Publishing in Nashville -

Hank, Jr.s publishing company steered by Merle Kilgore (Ring of

Fire). When we first met in 1999, I didn't

believe him. I was Chief Engineer at a prominent photoflash

company in Nashville and he was hired in as

the Customer Service rep. He kept getting phone calls where he

would say,"OK, Merle. Sure,

Merle...." So I asked him, "Who is Merle?" (thinking Haggard). "Oh,

Chad, no that's Merle Kilgore, Hanks

manager." "Sure..." I said. "Well, it's almost lunchtime, let's just go

on down to my office downtown."

"OK, Rob, let's go."

We walked in, and right underneath Hank's name on the marquee was 'Dallas Howard'. I didn't have to roll my pants legs up after all. It was like - WOW.

So, Rob sold the farm and moved to a houseboat outside of Gallatin, TN . as I write this. Due to a tragic boat accident, he is no longer with us, but he will always be with me, in my heart. I will always miss you, Rob. Godspeed. KG5RJD, QRT."

Thanks Chad for this great words I remember one time Hank came to the house sat there eating moms homemade beef stew before him and dad went off on a huntin and writin trip. Then a tractor show 2 weeks later. I never tell those stories in public because I always thought no one would ever believe them. Anyway dad only hung out with hank on a handful of trips. The truth of the matter is he became great friends with Merle Kilgore in 1996. They would always hangout and share songs and creative ideas at Merle's boogie shack. Or just take the pontoon out and fish till they were lit. Lol. Anyways after Merle past in 2005 he stopped writing as much. He took it hard. He mostly just wrote a few poems and a silly song here and there with His family. They were always good and he always loved playin.
