He found joy in sharing time with his family, children, grandchildren, and great-grandson. His faith was central to his life, and he never missed an opportunity to tell others

Urbane taught his children Godly morals and to walk upright before the Lord. He was always telling his children that they were just pilgrims passing through. 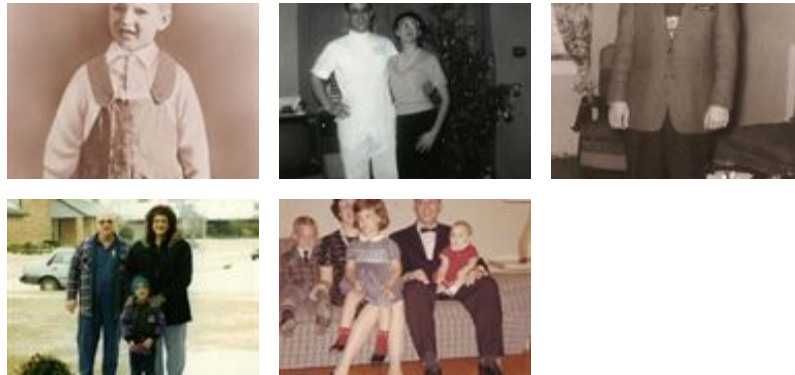
